

Spotlight on Veterans

9% of Americans are Veterans

(Approx. 21 Million)

Of 100 adults in the overall population:



8 are male veterans

1 is a woman veteran

40 are male nonveterans

51 are women nonveterans

VETERANS' BIGGEST CHALLENGES IN FINDING WORK

- Finding a work environment in which they feel comfortable.
- 2 Knowing what kind of jobs to apply for.
- Getting people to understand how their military experience translates to civilian work.
- Mnowing where to begin, including how to write a résumé and where to look for a job.




